A Note from the Pastor

In the past few months, I've had occasion to connect with some folks soon to be parishioners here. They're wrapping up their lives in other parts of the country and getting ready to begin a new phase here in the "northwest territories." They've had a chance to worship with us and, as a result, have "pre-registered" as parishioners. And they've made commitments to our Capital Campaign.

I find this humbling.

It suggests that, as we continue through Lent, it's important for us to make sure we pay attention not only to the quality of our personal lives with God, but to our common life with God as a parish. While parishes in South Carolina aren't every six blocks as they are elsewhere in the country, there is an opportunity to "pick and choose." So we might ask, "Why are we here?" What is it about Saint Andrew that makes it our parish of choice?

I'm not asking that you respond to me, but that we respond to ourselves. Just as - I hope - our Lenten reflection on our personal lives is fostering fresh commitments to what's best in our personal lives with God, I hope our reflection on our parish will foster fresh commitments to our life together as Saint Andrew.

One of the hoped-for outcomes of each year's Christ Renews His Parish weekends is a deeper sense of living our faith as a parishioner. This needn't mean joining something or taking on a ministry responsibility – though that's always welcome! What it does mean is that one has a deeper sense of being Catholic where it counts - around the dining room table, in the classroom, on the job, and as a citizen. And that this sense is strengthened by the consciousness of belonging to a parish that strives to "make a difference in the lives of others by living the love of God."

At the risk of seeming to influence your reflection, I hope that, among that which makes Saint Andrew your parish of choice, Sunday Mass and the way we come together to have our feet washed by breaking the bread and sharing the cup is at the top of the list. When parishioners of any parish find that Sunday Mass is penciled – and not inked – onto their calendars, then all the rest of what's attractive loses something. Sunday Eucharist – going as far back as the Acts of the Apostles – is the quintessential event in Catholic, and thus, parish life.

The folks I mentioned at the start of this note know us in, with, and through Sunday Mass. And you can be sure members of our family, classmates, co-workers, and neighbors know us in the same way. What do they know?
