# A Note From the Pastor

In 1989, as one more step in the collapse of the so-called Soviet bloc of puppet states in eastern Europe, Vaclav Havel, a Czechoslovakian writer and playwright who'd been imprisoned by the country's particularly oppressive Communist regime, became president of his newly liberated country. In his first presidential address, he made what I thought a harsh and incredible accusation, that the misery of his people under the Soviet thumb was their own fault. Recalling Russian tanks crush the 1968 "Prague Spring," a brief effort by the Czechs to loosen the Soviet grip, I wondered how Havel could make such a charge.

Havel claimed that, as vicious as Soviet occupation was, the Czech and Slovak peoples conspired to normalize it by lying. He told of the greengrocer who pitched a little sign in the midst of his goods laid out for sale. The sign carried a popular Soviet slogan. Not because the grocer believed it, but because he knew it was what the authorities wanted to see. A small lie, but "spoken" millions of times by millions like the grocer to curry favor and keep the authorities off their backs. It had the opposite effect.

Knowing that his disciples had a bit of the greengrocer's fear in the face of official suspicion of their master, Jesus brought his inner circle up a mountain and was transfigured before them. It was an attempt to strengthen their faith and courage as they headed up to Jerusalem where Jesus knew he would meet a bad end. Unfortunately, the inner circle was a lot like Havel's fellow citizens. They ended up being complicit in the death of the one they called "Teacher and Lord."

Matthew recounts this transfiguration in an effort to warn us that seeing heavenly wonders is not always enough to equip us with the courage needed to live the Gospel. Jesus' warning not to tell anyone about this evidenced his awareness that, while the event was powerful and showed him as the fulfillment of law (Moses) and prophecy (Elijah), such religious experiences are not enough. What's needed will be Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit. (Even the Resurrection by itself left the inner circle fearful and locked away.)

What the inner circle lacked on Good Friday, you and I have been given. "To whom much is given, much is expected."

In the midst of the "culture wars" tearing us apart, we can put up our own signs satisfying the expectations of the prevailing mood. But the Holy Spirit gives us a courage to avoid complicity with a supine culture fearful of the risks Jesus took to embrace the Samaritans, the women, the lepers, the tax collectors, and all those sidelined from life in his day.

We need to be sober about such courage. It's not an armor that protects us from the fate Jesus met. But it is a courage that, like a mustard seed, grows into a world that Jesus saw as the buried treasure and pearl of great price worth his sacrifice.

In the words of John Paul II: Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors for Christ. To his saving power open the boundaries of States, economic and political systems, the vast fields of culture, civilization and development. Do not be afraid. Fr. Dan
