## A Note From the Pastor

Old-timers like to talk about the "good old days", but no one really wants to backtrack. And even if we were willing to go back, we can never re-capture time. What we <u>can</u> do is use change to find different ways of living and acting to sustain values that are forever and always. Values not always well appreciated in a by gone era. Values like those brought to our attention in today's Gospel.

When Joseph Ratzinger was elected Pope Benedict XVI, a lot of people groaned. For a quarter-century, Ratzinger had built up a reputation as a hardliner when it came to church discipline. He took no prisoners.

While pope, he was asked, what – after all these years – he might have done differently in life. To the surprise of many, he said that he wished he'd been less severe as a young priest working in a parish. In particular he regretted the grief he'd caused lukewarm Catholic parents seeking Baptism for a child. In those days he'd seen his job as protecting the integrity of the sacrament. He'd been afraid of being soft, of risking truth over mercy.

In this week's Gospel we have an instance of well-meaning apostles trying to discipline those who want access to Jesus but deemed unworthy of what Jesus has to offer – himself. The disciples had absorbed well the attitude of the scribes and Pharisees that rambunctious kids, prostitutes, lukewarm Jews, tax collectors, known sinners were ineligible for Jesus' attention. And yet, in each instance, Jesus overrules them.

It's interesting the way the scene in today's Gospel gets played out. A quick read can leave us with the impression that Jesus didn't have time for this woman. And calling her a "dog" takes our breath away. But if we pay more attention to the reading we see that Jesus deliberately plays into the disciples' *faux* righteousness to leave them with a powerful lesson.

If Jesus really had no time for the likes of this pagan Canaanite, what was he doing in the region of Tyre and Sidon? It was pagan territory. Whom did expect to find there? When the woman finally talks with Jesus, she exhibits a faith in him that some of the disciples lacked. And when Jesus set her up, telling her she wasn't entitled to what belong to God's people, she showed that, while she might not be a card-carrying Jew, she was hungry for what God had promised Israel – compassion. Mercy.

Pope Benedict regretted not being easier on people, regretted being stingy with God's grace.

With our wives and husbands, kids and parents, brothers and sisters, neighbors, friends, and the people at school and work; with those we don't even know but read about, we have a chance to put this Gospel into practice. Taking a risk on mercy and remembering the words of the poet George Eliot who wrote, "When death, the great reconciler, has come, it is never our tenderness that we repent of, but our severity."

## Our Weekly Parish Tithe

The week's tithe goes to the HELPING HANDS OF CLEMSON Children's Home. Having opened its doors in 1984, this state-licensed program's mission is to provide abused and/or neglected boys, ages 12-21, with a safe place to live, food, clothing, education, healthcare, and counseling. Most come from Anderson, Greenville, Oconee, and Pickens Counties. The 14,000 sq. ft. shelter is open year-round and can care for up to 32 boys at a time, serving more than 8,550 children since opening its doors. The program employs 20+ caregivers, referred to as House Parents, and four cooks. The children stay until DSS can reunite them with their families. If not possible, DSS will attempt to place the children with other relatives or through adoption. All students attend school, and the Home focuses on their holistic needs, including teaching life skills, how to maintain healthy relationships, work and study habits, housing and money management/budgeting, computer/internet safety, self-care, and career/education planning.
