## Hunger Awareness and Clemson Community Care Food Drive

Thank you to everyone who donated food this week to kick off our Clemson Community Care food drive. **Suggested donations for the remaining weeks in September:**

**September 17:** canned vegetables, rice, cereal, peanut butter, flour, paper towels

**September 24:** tomato sauce and paste, grits, canned or shelf-stable milk, toilet paper

College students, consider donating jars of pasta sauce each week. Any donation of non-perishable food items is always welcome.

The negative effects of food insecurity are not relegated to short-term hunger. The long-term health effects, especially for children, truly drive home the importance of addressing this issue.

Since COVID, Clemson Community Care has been distributing 2000 pounds of food a day. That means that the average amount of food we collect on a weekend during our food drive will be barely enough for one day. So, we would suggest that you talk to a friend/neighbor/colleague about CCC and ask them if they support CCC. Especially if they are new to the area. It is going to take more than our parish to stock the shelves.

## A Note From the Pastor

One of the most important of the many accomplishments of the last council of the Church (1962-1965) was the redesign of the Eucharist. After almost five centuries of Mass being structurally designed as the work of the priest (the “old” Mass has no rubrics for the congregation – the people didn’t need to be there), the rubrics for the Order of Mass today acknowledge that the Eucharist is the “source and summit” of the whole Church’s prayer life.

While it drives some people crazy to hear of the priest at Mass described as the Presider, that’s exactly his task – to oversee the ordering of all the ministries – deacon, lector, acolyte (aka, “server”), choir, ushers, ministers of Communion – and the priest’s own role.

It’s time again for us to replenish the ranks of our various ministries. In preparation for a new schedule of Mass ministries come October 2, we’ll have two formation sessions for those willing to serve the rest of us in exercising the various ministries designed to help all of us worship as Jesus asked us to worship – namely, to gather together in memoriam of his serving life and saving death exemplified in his Last Supper at which he fed his disciples with himself so that they might live as he did – washing feet.

The importance of these ministries comes from their focus – to help the “assembly” (aka, congregation) absorb what God offers in Word and Sacrament. There’s nothing more important that we do as a parish than celebrate the Eucharist.

The great 4th century bishop, Athanasius, in offering a meditation of how God “orders” the diversity of creation, helps us to appreciate how the Holy Spirit “orders” our worship: *A choir is composed of a variety of men, women, and children, of both old and young. Under the direction of one conductor, each sings in the way that is natural for him: men with men’s voices, boys with boys’ voices, old people with old voices, young people with young voices. Yet all of them produce a single harmony. Or consider the example of our soul. It moves our senses according to their several functions so that in the presence of a single object they all act simultaneously: the eye sees, the ear hears, the hand touches, the nose smells, the tongue tastes, and often the other parts of the body act as well as, for example, the feet may walk.*

“Formation” sessions (only one session needs to be attended) will be held on **Tuesday, September 19 from 7:00–8:30 PM** and again on **Thursday, September 21 from 6:00–7:30 PM** in the church. More information will be forthcoming.

As a “church” (Greek, *ecclesia*, meaning “a people called out from”), we worship in gratitude for our common calling. And learn from Word and Sacrament what that calling should look like as we fulfill it at home, in school, as neighbors, fellow citizens, and co-workers.

The week's tithe goes to **Clemson Meals on Wheels and Meals on Wheels of Pickens County**.

**Pickens County Meals on Wheels (PCMOW)** exists to combat the effects of hunger, loneliness, and isolation on senior citizens living in Pickens County. PCMOW provides a lifeline of help, particularly meals, through the use of caring volunteers. They strive to provide the most cost-effective service to help individuals "age in place" while maintaining their health, independence, and quality of life. This organization not only provides meals but a continuum of care for active, aging, and homebound individuals, including social, cultural, and educational activities. They also connect individuals and their families to other services and agencies clients might need while striving to ensure the seniors feel they are valued members of our community. To qualify, clients must be homebound and physically or mentally challenged to the point where meal preparation is nearly impossible. The meals provided are healthy and are planned on a four-week rotating menu. If the volunteers cannot make contact with a participant, they make every effort to ensure the recipient is safe. **Clemson Meals On Wheels** has been serving those living within the Clemson city limits since 1974. With no paid staff positions, 99% of their revenue goes toward the food they deliver. Volunteers (from Clemson students to retirees) deliver 200-225 warm meals each week to qualifying residents year-round who, for reasons of health, age, or disability, cannot prepare a well-balanced meal for themselves. Most clients live alone, and some see no one else each day. Meals cost \$6 each, but most clients receive their meals for free. Each midday meal, prepared by Ingles deli, is accompanied by a courtesy copy of *The Journal*, and a friendly visit. Drivers have one route and deliver once a week. Some drivers share a route so that they deliver less frequently. Opportunities to contribute include delivering meals, donating funds, and serving on the volunteer Board.
