#### A Note From the Pastor

"Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." A familiar saying that we'll be hearing in this Sunday's Gospel. As we all know, many Christians will rely on this quote to insist that religion and politics (aka, "life in the polis, or city) don't mix. But such reliance is premised on ignorance of something essential.

So, readying ourselves for Sunday, an important truth needs to be kept in mind -Eternal salvation is open to those who, through no fault of their own, do not know Christ and his Church but seek God with a sincere heart, and under the inspiration of grace try in their lives to do his will, made known to them by the dictates of their conscience. Nor does Divine Providence deny the aids necessary for salvation to those who, without blame on their part, have not yet reached an explicit belief in God, but strive to lead a good life, under the influence of God's grace.

Whatever goodness and truth is found among them is seen by the Church as a preparation for the Gospel, and as given by him who shines on all men, so that they may at last have life.

Thus the Church teaches in the seminal document, Lumen Gentium ("Light to the Nations") promulgated in the last Church council. It's a teaching that echoes the saying, "God is bound to the sacraments, but not by the sacraments." A saying bolstered by this Sunday's first reading.

In a nutshell, the grace of God is prevalent beyond "religion" as understood by those who would see politics and religion as two distinct worlds. Thus, "politics" - like economics, the arts, and sports – is a dynamic of life that needs to be animated by those – think us and our parish – who have been chosen as agents of God's grace.

The example of our politics should be so gospel-like that folks are curious about why we are so different from those who stoke the fires of division and discord.

Our mission is the ability to answer those moved by our example. None of us needs a theology degree to evangelize in this fashion. We do need to know Jesus personally. And we do need to explain that our Sunday worship is for the sake of having Jesus feed us with himself so that, becoming what we eat, we do as he asked – wash one another's feet. Sunday Mass is the memorial – lest we forget – that Jesus went to the Cross because of how he went among the people of his day. And remind those we're speaking to that the consequences of what we believe are the same for us as they were for Jesus. Each day, we carry our Cross – not simply our aches and pains, disappointments and tragedies - but the push-back from societies and cultures that thrive on values inimical to Jesus oft posed question, "What would you have me do for you?" Our Sacramental Prep class is preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The 2nd Graders work on learning the Act of Contrition by placing the words together like a puzzle as a class together.

The sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation is the emphasis on mercy, forgiveness, and healing. Teaching Catholic Kids recommends making regular confession a habit by scheduling it on your calendar and giving it the same priority as a dentist or car maintenance appointment. Start by committing to attend three times a year: once during Advent, once during Lent, and once over the summer. If you already go that often, make it a habit to go once a month.
