A Note From the Pastor

"Love" is a word that does a lot of work. Sometimes the work is trivial: I love my car! I love chocolate ice cream. Didn't you just love that new restaurant? Other times the work is lethal: people who, for the "love" of God or some cause, provoke violence and death.

"Love" is elusive. Someone wrote that it's like a chameleon: it hides in the hue of everything. To most of us, it means feeling wonderful. Most of us think that love should fix things, change them, renew them. Certainly it ought to make us feel better about ourselves and the world. It should make life light and easy, a joy, an ecstasy, bliss. But, what did it mean to lesus?

A quick look at Mediterranean culture sheds some light on the question. Our ancestors in the faith were strongly group-centered: family, village, neighborhood, and factions (like the Twelve, the Pharisees, etc.). One's identity came from one's groups. "We are who we belong to." The group was an external conscience that exerted tremendous pressure on its members. In this kind of a world, love and hate are all about group attachment or group detachment. Whether emotion or affection is involved is beside the point. The major feeling in love and hate is a feeling of belonging or not belonging. So whatever else Jesus understood about love, he certainly understood that to love God with all one's heart means that one is totally attached to God. And to love your neighbor as yourself is to be as totally attached to the people in your neighborhood or immediate circle of friends as you are to your family. To love is to cast your lot with, to be in solidarity with, the one you love. And a love worth its name does not come and go as feelings wax and wane.

Jesus' answer to his questioner was not earthshaking. His first answer is straight from the Book of Deuteronomy (6:5). It's the prayer devout Jews say every morning and night. The command to love God absolutely was to be "written on the heart" and drilled into the memory of every child. The second part of his answer, "You must love your neighbor as yourself," is found in Leviticus (19:18). What might have raised some eyebrows is that Jesus puts both of these commands on equal footing. Remember, Jesus hadn't been asked for two great laws, but he gave two as one. The will of God and the purpose of our life is to love God with our whole being and our neighbors as ourselves. The second is just like the first: our love of God is mirrored in our love of neighbor. Where there is little love of neighbor, there's little love of God. Love involves heart and will, soul and life, mind and strength. It makes demands. It's not mere ardor; it is arduous.

The Israelites would have taken these words as instructions on how to live together as a people, not simply as how to get along with this or that individual. We shall not wrong a resident alien. We shall not abuse widows or orphans. If we lend money to the poor, we must not treat them as creditors or exact interest from them. If we take anything as collateral that a neighbor needs, we must return it before the sun goes down.

With Jesus, love is even more challenging. He makes it clear that love is serving others, even laying down our lives for them. What does that look like? Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians gives us a snapshot of what love in everyday life looks like: Love is patient. It is kind. It's not jealous or conceited, rude or selfish. It doesn't take offense, nor is it resentful. It is always ready to trust, to excuse, and to endure.

A pretty romantic picture of love. Until we think about the week ahead. What's our love going to look like?

For the Easter Vigil, a specific order is prescribed; however, for our All Saints Day Masses, we exercise more freedom and include in the list the saints who are remembered in the windows of our Chapel, as well as those who have more recently been canonized such as Kateri Tekakwitha and John Henry Newman. If you listen carefully to the recitation of the saints' names during the processional on October 31 and November 1, you may recognize some of these saints.

The saints are viewed as companions and friends as well as patrons and mediators. They are friends – of God, of each other, and they are our friends as well. They are also companions on the journey, guides, and mentors. We and they are in solidarity with one another; they embrace us as fellow friends of God.
