A Note From the Pastor

When we were growing up, how often did we hear our folks, teachers, and coaches tell us to "Pay attention"? It's good advice if we want to stay on our parents' good side, get a good grade, or win a game. But paying attention is more than attending to the essentials of toeing the line or achieving a goal.

Traveling to and from my vacation spot last month, I listened to the lady in my phone telling me when and where to turn, and to the signage she invariably mispronounced. But more than the facts, I was alert to what was along the various back roads and highways she told me to take. I noticed the homes (how they're built and kept), the stores and what they were peddling (not a lot of Whole Foods along the roads of rural South Carolina and Georgia), and even the fields (what's planted or not). I saw that for every Baptist church built of brick there were 5-7 small wooden affairs, often cheek-to-jowl with a similarly ramshackle Methodist chapel. I saw what wasn't there. Not a Catholic church – or sign showing the way to one – anywhere. And in noticing and seeing I thought about the kinds of lives beyond the real estate. I thought about what I was thinking about what I was seeing: lousy roads (80% of the time); a few "Christian academies" and their sordid histories.

"Paying attention" takes us beyond what we see to the why and wherefore of what feeds the eye. It's "value added" to getting from Point A to Point B. Yet, I think it's essential to getting to know the world we live in. Everything and everyone has a backstory.

We've recently been taken along the road to a new Speaker of the House. A job that's second in line for the presidency and key to prioritizing the matters that govern things like how our – and the which of the "our" – voice is heard in how we live as a country. What was the backstory?

We're deluged with awful news of terror and death in the Middle East. Who is involved? In what? And, why? Where do the facts leave us? The backstory?

It's the same way with our faith.

Coming to the end of another Church year, we've – again – heard Matthew's Gospel. It's a Gospel that gives us a new law, a new architecture in which to live. What does that say about the law giver? About virtue and sin? We've kept the "Lord's Day" holy with Mass week after week. What's holiness in light of the Beatitudes?

I got to my vacation spot by listening to the lady in my phone. But getting there left me with a new take on the trip as more than a series of left and right turns and holding to the speed limit on the straightaways. I came away with a sense of rural poverty, of what life without the investment of tax dollars can be like, of the commitment to be a church even if you can't have towers and bells and social halls. Of the persistence of age-old prejudices. Of why people might vote as they do.

Coming to an end of another church year, and having traveled the Gospel of Matthew for a year, how has it made us different? Or weren't we paying attention? Fr. Dan
