A Note From the Pastor

In the midst of the "roaring 20s," as waves of nationalism and secularism were on the rise, Pope Pius XI instituted the Solemnity of Christ the King in 1925 as a reminder that Christ reigns. While human governments will fade away, Christ's remains eternal. To acknowledge Christ as king is to put our trust in his care, to fit our plans into his, so that his will is done *on earth-in us-as it is in heaven*.

Pope Benedict XVI noted, *"It is in the very offering of himself … that Jesus becomes King of the universe."* His sacrifice for <u>all</u> humanity reminds us to follow his example and offer ourselves in service of others. Pope Francis remarks: *"The kingdoms of this world at times are sustained by arrogance, rivalries and oppression; the reign of Christ is a "kingdom of justice, love and peace … Jesus is the center of creation; and so the attitude demanded of us as true believers is that of recognizing and accepting in our lives the centrality of Jesus Christ, in our thoughts, in our words and in our works."*

For a Christian, speaking of power and strength means referring to the power of the Cross and the strength of Jesus' love, a *"harsh and dreadful thing in action"* which remains steadfast and complete, even when faced with rejection.

The kingship of Christ is often symbolized in art by draping Jesus in the regalia of national and imperial monarchs. Which does no justice to Jesus. The symbols of his kingship are the lives each of us lives.

To that end, as we complete one Church year and begin another, we might borrow a secular custom of making "new year's" resolutions to ensure that in our Church's new year we not only give voice to our faith, but also turn that voice into action: working to overcome bashfulness at Mass and singing (which is really praying); being a better educated Catholic for the work of being "salt, light, and leaven" in everyday life by staying connected to the news and assessing it in light of the Gospel; enriching our confessions by concentrating on attitudes and actions that cripple our relationships and so warrant what the sacrament offers – Reconciliation; prepping for a day's work by determining one or two things that insinuate Gospel values into tasks, evaluations, plans, and relationships with co-workers.

This feast day is just that – a day. What we celebrate is a way of life. **Fr. Dan**
