A Note From the Pastor

Today we conclude the shortest Advent season possible (when Christmas falls on a Monday). While this is bad news for the merchants, it can nudge us to remember the real "reason for the season." That nudge takes us back to the Middle Ages and the work of my Franciscan confrere, John Duns Scotus ("John, from the village of Duns in Scotland").

Scotus lived in the 14th century and was a figure in the revival of learning after the Dark Ages, and the efforts of scholars such as Scotus and Aquinas to deepen our faith using the newly-appreciated human faculty of reason. Among other insights, Scotus made the point that the Incarnation, God-in-the-flesh, was not God's "Plan B," resulting from Original Sin. Scotus asserted that sin or no sin, Christmas would have happened. The "reason for the season" is the reason for Creation itself – God's passionate love for us,

Scripture and Tradition tell us that God is Love. Thus, Scotus pointed out, there must – in the nature of God – be a lover and a beloved. Thus, God is Trinity of three persons in a communion of love. This Trinity who creates us – and all that exists - is the model of all reality and especially of human relationships.

Because God loves, he wills that creation should also be infused by love. Since love must go out to another, it is only right that the pinnacle of creation's love should be God himself, for nothing God creates within creation could be more lovable than the God who created.

For creation to be able to love with God's love, there must be at least one created being capable of that highest love. That created being is the human nature of Christ. And so God willed the union of the Son's divine nature with a human nature in the person of Christ. Thus, Christ is the masterpiece of love in the midst of a Creation designed for love, rather than a divine repair man come to fix the mess of original sin. The "reason for the season" is a celebration and adoration of God's love.

So, what difference does this make?

Christmas becomes a celebration of why Creation exists at all. In the midst of discouragement with the state of the world, Christmas calls our attention to the fact that, sin-scarred as we've made Creation to be, we haven't erased its purpose - namely, that God desires to love and be loved. And if that's the "reason for the season," it should be reflected in the way we celebrate the holiday, and it should be the takeaway from that celebration long after the tree is gone and the toys are banged up.

So, this Christmas, give some thought to why our world exists. And we with it. We're keen on taking care of the good things we have; consider how we're taking care of Creation – starting with one another.
