A Note From the Pastor

As December ends and January dawns, we remember that the new month takes its name from the Roman god Janus, a deity with two faces - one looking ahead, and the other looking back. Janus is the god presiding over beginnings and endings, comings and goings, wars and peace. He is the god of change.

For us, Jesus is "Janus," a one-faced God who is both Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. The God of change who "makes all things new."

Every year ending will donate a host of "joys and hopes, griefs and anxieties" to the year beginning. And our typical new year celebrations will focus on harvesting the experiences and learnings of the past year such that they'll do us some good and give us a "happy new year." For guidance in this harvesting, we might look to a key document from the last Council of the Church, Vatican II (1962–1965). The document is aptly titled, Gaudium et spes ("Joys and hope" and hereafter in this note referred to as GS), addressing those "joys and hopes" as well a remembering our "griefs and anxieties." GS focuses on our role in the world as "salt, light, and leaven" in areas ranging from politics to peace to service of one another, guiding us to become living evidence that the authentic meaning of life can be found only in Christ. It's not a task for the fainthearted.

GS focuses on our privilege as disciples to help our worlds of family, work, economics, and politics live beyond our griefs and anxieties by imitating Christ. Such imitation is authentic humanism. And, as the Gospel bears witness, we find that humanism outside Christ's Church. But as Jesus said, those who are not against him are with him even if they do not - yet! - know him.

As we begin 2024, war in the Middle East is calling into question what we mean by justice and self-defense, mutual aid, and a rule-based human society. Its most immediate victims – as in any war – are truth and the lives of the innocent. Within our own country, we begin the year saddled with one of most unproductive and dysfunctional Congresses in our history, an ethically-suspect Court, and a geriatric executive. "Election 2024" is in full swing with one likely presidential candidate already convicted of fraud and defamation, and facing a dozen more indictments of federal and local laws. And with an angry, tired electorate that is more illiterate than not when it comes to both our history and current events. GS can serve as a wise guide for tempering our mood, educating ourselves, and choosing platforms and persons worthy of our vote in light of our most noble and humane aspirations.

In the midst of all this, the Church in the US will continue to seek a revival of faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. GS offers – in my judgment – the best way to do that. What greater evidence of the Real Presence of Christ in the bread broken and cup shared than our becoming a people whose washing of one another's feet celebrates the joy and hope of the Gospel as the "medicine" for our griefs and anxieties.

May our new year bring us what we need to be a people in whom God sees the fulfillment of his dream in creating us. Fr. Dan

Christ Renews His Parish Men's and Women's Weekends


MEN: FEBRUARY 10-11 • WOMEN: MARCH 2-3 • NO OVERNIGHT STAY

The week's tithe goes to Family Promise whopse mission is to meet the immediate needs of homeless families in crisis. Collaborating with the community and local congregations, Family Promise provides shelter, meals, and comprehensive support services for guest families to achieve self-sufficiency. In addition to its shelter program, Family Promise also offers a homelessness prevention program that helps struggling families stay in their homes and rebuild their lives. Recently Family Promise, a church in Pickens, and the Pickens County School System assisted a father and his two children move from homeless to a home of their own. In addition to providing temporary shelter, meals, and clothing, extensive case management helped the family obtain long overdue medical care, assisted the father find employment, and helped address the root causes of their homeless situation. This family's life is a testimony to God's loving care. They have gone from having nothing, not being a part of society, children not enrolled in school, and lacking medical care to a place where the father has full-time employment, they have moved into a home of their own, and are filled with hope for their new life. Saint Andrew is a Family Promise support congregation, with Judi Nicks (637-8154, judi@alumni.clemson.edu) and Pat Marcondes (650-5830, patm@clemson.edu) serving as our volunteer coordinators.
