Spring Kairos Walk Needs Volunteers

Kairos is a 4-day retreat held inside the walls of a prison. It is held in prisons all around the world. This April, there will be a Kairos Walk at Perry

Correctional Institution in Pelzer, South Carolina. This Walk needs 40 volunteers in order to happen. It is an ecumenical team of volunteers from churches all across the Upstate. The Walk starts on Thursday afternoon, April 18, continues all day Friday and Saturday, April 19 and 20, and finishes at 2:00 PM on Sunday, April 21. There are six training sessions on Tuesday evenings starting January 30 (and every other week after that up to the week of the Walk). Tom Brennan and Deacon John Leininger are on the team, and you can talk with them about how much this means to the incarcerated men at Perry. The people on the team itself are men, but meals are cooked at a local church and women can volunteer to help with one or more meals. A Note From the Pastor

Last week, I made note of the priests' convocation speaker's insistence on the involvement of parents in the faith formation of their kids. I'd go so far as to say the same holds true for adult parishioners.

No one expects parents or most adults to be up on the curricula for various levels of faith formation. But children and young people expect adults to evidence a reason why the adults promote the faith formation of the young. It's no different than the young expecting adults to evidence the good behaviors and observance of the law that adults promote. But too few adults feel comfortable talking about God and about their lives as disciples. And that discomfort rubs off on our young.

Christ Renews His Parish (CRHP) is important – I'd go so far as to say necessary – for a parish that cares about the next generation's relationship with God. CRHP is not a seminar or a Bible Study. It's an opportunity for adults to get comfortable with their own life with God, speaking about its strengths, weaknesses, certainties, and doubts. CRHP is about strengthening one's comfort zone praying with others. It's about enjoying the confirmation that "I'm not the only one" with doubts and struggles.

Insofar as CRHP is a learning experience, the learning comes, not from lectures, but from man-to-man, woman-to-woman talking with neighbors and fellow parishioners. Like all men do with their buddies and women with their girlfriends. Talking about faith as we talk about so many other things in life – our families, kids, in-laws, neighbors, jobs, sports, bosses, and co-workers. You get the picture.

The genius of CRHP is that it's hosted, not by priests and evangelists flown in with their books and videos to sell. It's hosted by the folks you fight with for a Sunday morning parking spot. The folks that the pastor wants you to say hello to before Mass!

We know that kids and young people learn by watching and listening. Lectures go in one ear and out the other. But what they see us older folks do, what they sense we think is important – that sticks.

Just because you might not have kids in the house, you've got them surrounding you at Sunday Mass. You're not likely to talk about God with them before or after Mass. But having become more comfortable with your own life with God will make a difference in how you pray the Mass. You might even lip-synch the hymns you're too bashful to sing! And people will notice.

Sometimes, what we "say" doesn't involve words. Last Sunday, I chatted with a guy whom I usually see with his wife and toddlers. Now they have a newborn. And right now, the whole gang can't get to the same Mass. So, his wife went to one, he to another. (Exactly like my folks.) In our chat, we didn't say a word about the day's Gospel. But his standing in front of me spoke volumes. Francis of Assisi allegedly said, "Always preach the gospel. Use words if you must." CRHP will give you words. And more.

It is not too early to start considering what we would like to give up for Lent. Catholic Dad, Ryan Lang suggests **5 Lenten fasts that benefit God's creation:**

- **1. Give up warm showers** Hot showers are a drain on water and the energy needed to warm them up, plus there are many proven health benefits to cold showers.
- 2. Give up plastic bottles and cans
- 3. Give up unnecessary driving
- **4. Give up wasting electricity** remember to turn off and unplug unnecessary lights and appliances
- **5. Give up meat** According to a 2008 *Time* magazine article, reducing your meat consumption by just 20 percent has the same effect as switching from a gas-powered car to a Prius.

These fasts can have a lasting effect on God's creation and you and your child's future. Let's consider these easy Lenten fasts to help our children develop healthy habits.

A Re-start to Little Saints and Youth Choir

We hope to have a sizable group of singers, since whether and when we sing in church will be determined by the number and regularity of participants. Besides, it's much more fun to sing with a bunch of friends!


