A Note From the Pastor

One of our parish's best kept secrets is our RCIA ("Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults"). In a nutshell, this is a process by which men and women discern whether or not God is calling them to live a developing faith in Jesus within the Roman Catholic Church. Originally the process included only unbaptized adults. But like many parishes, we include Catholic adults seeking to be confirmed and Christians baptized in other Christian traditions (e.g., Baptist, Lutheran) discerning a call to "full communion" with the Catholic Church.

Currently we have 34 adults involved, collegians being the center of gravity.

It's called a "process" because it recognizes that one isn't readied for any of the above goals – Baptism, Confirmation, or full communion – simply by digesting a catechism of information. It sees "conversion" as the often slow but sure development of a personal relationship with Jesus and the implications of the relationship as a disciple with a mission. Information – catechetics – is important, but more so is acquiring the "heart and mind" of Jesus and growing and living that acquisition by seeing the world as the Catholic Church believes Jesus saw it. And still does.

Memorizing the catechism is one thing. Adopting the lifestyle it ought to lead one to is quite another.

Everyone moves at his or her own pace. Participants are encouraged to join us for Sunday Mass. Some topic relevant to Christian identity and living is addressed each week.

Each Sunday, between the morning Masses, it's my privilege to meet with this group. I'm also meeting with each participant to hear the story of grace working within them. These chats have been amazing! And humbling. Each has a unique tale of someone – family member, friend, classmate, boyfriend or girlfriend – who has been key in bringing them to this discernment.

It's a reminder that the most effective work of evangelizing is done by folks who'd describe themselves as average Catholics. As I suspect most of us would. Which means that every one of us who labels ourselves as "average" in our faith life is capable of doing what the Church exists for.

My experience with RCIA participants bears witness to the fact none of us who take our faith seriously should underestimate the effect of that "taking" on others.

As we ready for Lent, thinking of what we 're going "to do" for Lent, we ought to add gratitude to our "prayer, fasting, and almsgiving." Gratitude for the grace of caring about our faith, knowing that it's making a difference in the lives of others.

Faith Formation

5K FAITH FORMATION CLASS –

Recently, our 5K students took a "field trip" to our parish sanctuary to learn about parts and practices of the Church. Thank you, Ms. Anna and Ms. Diane, for teaching our children to familiarize themselves and feel comfortable in the house of God. God expects children to be present in worship, hearing instructions, promises, and encouragements written directly to them.



PRETZELS – A memorable way for your children to learn about Lent, may be to bake pretzels with them. They may be reminded of the simplicity of fasting throughout Lent every time they eat them. *Teaching Catholic Kids* provides a little history to incorporate with the baking.

The pretzel has great historical and spiritual significance. As the faithful in the old Roman Empire kept a very strict fast all through Lent – no dairy products, eggs, or meat – they made small breads of water, flour, and salt to accompany their simple meals of fish, fruit, and vegetables. To remind themselves that Lent was a time of prayer, they shaped the breads in the form of arms crossed in prayer. The Latin word *braccellae*, "little arms," eventually became the Germanic "pretzel."

TRADITIONAL PRETZELS

- 1 pkg. dry yeast
 - 1-1/4 C. warm water
 - 1 tsp. salt
 - 1 tbsp. sugar
 - 4 C. flour
 - 1/4 C. melted butter
 - 1 beaten egg
- Dissolve yeast in water. Add salt and sugar. Blend in flour. Knead dough until smooth. Cut into small pieces. Roll into ropes and twist into pretzel shape. Place on lightly greased cookie sheets. Brush pretzels with beaten egg. Sprinkle with coarse salt if desired. Bake at 375° F about 15 minutes.
