A Note From the Pastor

Jesus tells us to pick up our cross and follow him.

As I mentioned in a homily on the Thursday after Ash Wednesday, this command is not about shouldering the unpleasant tasks of everyday life. It's not about gritting our teeth and going forward with life hampered by illness or any other debilitating personal condition.

What Jesus' command **is** all about is living each day in a way that brings on the cross.

Crucifixion was a painful and humiliating form of death designed for rebels. For those who pushed back against the Roman regime and all it symbolized. Jesus went to the cross because his gospel was a threat to life as Rome believed life ought to be lived.

You and I, then, are called to live a life that threatens whatever in our culture is contrary to the gospel. And answering that call, we should expect to experience the pain and humiliation of the rejection Jesus suffered.

Hardly a way of life any of us wants.

And so many of us domesticate our faith. As a pet lover domesticates a cat or dog to live in a "domus," Latin for "house," so we take the gospel and make it livable in the culture we call "home." We go along to get along.

And lose our souls in the process.

But the pet owner has an advantage over us. The owner knows the signs of "wildness" that need taming. We often don't. Over the centuries, the grindingly slow domestication of the gospel, conforming it to justify a morality that flies in the face of our Church's social teaching, has led many to write-off our social moral teaching as just some political agenda.

And we respond with an insidious effort to promote a personal spirituality that ignores our social teaching. Many well-funded Catholic evangelical movements cheat those hungry for God with a thin gruel that offers little or no encouragement to challenge the Rome we live in. Personal piety becomes a mind-numbing docility in the face of social defects that marginalize the very people whom Jesus said are himself in our midst, (cf. Matthew 25).

The need for repentance – picking up our cross – is at the heart of Lent. The historical penances for the season – prayer, fasting, and almsgiving – are actions aimed at rejuvenating our faith. And <u>faith is an action</u>. It's why the words we heard as ashes were imposed called us to "believe in" or "live" the gospel.

And the gospel is the faith and life that leads to resurrection.
