A Note From the Pastor

Recently, one of our collegians was astonished to learn that, when at their age, I knew a lot of people who'd been born in the late 1800s. Of course that included my grandparents, but also some folks up and down my street. And in my 20s I too thought that the 1800s were forever ago! Then I did some math and realized that, given my year of birth, I'm to a collegian today what someone born in 1896 was to me when I was in college! So now, my college friend knows someone from forever ago. As I did.

I grew up with my mom coaching us to add a petition to our night prayers that God "bring the soldiers home." They were fighting the Korean War. Like a lot of you, I lived through the Civil Rights Movement and the resulting "disestablishment of authority" (don't trust anyone over 30!) as northern white "freedom riders" – many of whom were collegians – learned that the "land of the free" really wasn't if you were Black. In college, the country was grappling with the turmoil of the Vietnam War and an increasingly hungry military draft. I grew up not only with just landline phones, but a phone on a "party line." Meaning, when the phone rang, we waited – one ring, it was for the Falconer's, our neighbors; two short rings, it was for us. I remember our family car had running boards, that our milkman kept things cold with real ice, and the "athletic shoes" we wore were called "sneakers," never worn with anything but white socks.

Times have changed. But can the same be said of our faith?

Many of us still define our faith – as we did "back then" – around observables that we thought then were eternal. And meant to be.

But when Jesus "cleansed the Temple" (today's Gospel) he was breaking the bonds of an artifact of a past age. He was doing something new. God's earthly dwelling was no longer to be seen as a matter of brick and mortar, but of minds and hearts. Which is not to say we were wrong to build a new church. Unless we forget why we built it.

In a world where so many of us are angry and feel disenfranchised by institutions that cater to the one percent, our Eucharist reminds us, week after week, that we "take and eat, take and drink" of a Messiah who lived the love of God for the sake of the so-called "basket of deplorables." Jesus' goal was not to stoke their resentment but to suffer with and for them. And to fire them up with his zeal for a "faith that does justice."

The Church of my youth was keen on preserving an alternative culture. Our churches and schools were where we were supposed to find God. The Church of today is called to "open wide the doors" (as per John Paul II) of our lives such that we shoulder "the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time, especially of those who are poor or afflicted."

Last Sunday, I suggested that election years give us a chance to examine our desired future. And to do something on its behalf. As disciples, that chance comes each Sunday. As we hear the Scriptures. And break the Bread. And then get back to daily life, hopefully a people better focused and able to live the love of God.

Times have changed. Have we? Fr. Dan
