## A Note from the Pastor

With the Easter celebrations behind us, our sights are now set on Pentecost.

We'll notice the Sunday readings being something of a reprise of "all that Jesus said and did" in his three-years of tutoring his disciples. A necessity, given their behavior in the face of his Passion and Death. And maybe a necessity for us.

There are two movements afoot in our country suggesting that, like the apostles, we too have not quite gotten the first round of prep for discipleship as Jesus hoped we would.

"Christian nationalism," prevalent among America's Christians, and "integralism," a more philosophical (with social and political implications) Catholic version of the same, pose real challenges to what we'll remember – come Pentecost – is Jesus' legacy for us to live

Both "Christian nationalism" and "integralism" have been around for a while but have recently been dusted off and are being promoted as reasons for making our choices in the upcoming election. "Nationalism" is basically the conviction that the US was founded as a Christian nation. And while there's tolerance for folks of other religious persuasions, the Bible is the blueprint for civic life.

"Integralism," a more thoughtful and complicated point of view, sees the state harnessed to the Church.

While Pentecost will celebrate our calling to preach, "using words if necessary," and while our "culture wars" are being fought by "armies" promoting the Gospel, and while political camps are twisting the Gospel into planks for party platforms, neither "nationalism" nor integralism are answers to what we all seek: the good life as God sees the good.

As historically wrong as "nationalism" is, and as – in my opinion – cumbersome as integralism is, both end-run the lesson of how to evangelize that led to the explosive growth in the Church's earliest days, namely that the "good" as exposed by the serving life and saving death of Jesus is manifested in a personal relationship with him that becomes ecclesial – communitarian – and ends up being a style of life that sells itself.

Big time!

But the coinage of that "sale" is significant, and one most of us want to avoid. Hence our resort to bad history and to law, not as "rules for the road," but as a cudgel, both sparing us the real cost.

More about that cost next week. Fr. Dan

Creation and Song

Listening to the first reading of the Easter Vigil – the story of the Creation from the first chapter of Genesis - the final phrase of verse 16 stands out when read by a skilled lector: "and he made the stars." That simple phrase always hearkens a memory from The Magician's Nephew, the sixth book in C. S. Lewis' "The Chronicles of Narnia." In it, the great lion, Aslan, creates the world by singing it into existence. Lewis writes "Then two wonders happened at the same moment. One was that the voice was suddenly joined by other voices; more voices than you could possibly count. They were in harmony with it, but far higher up the scale: cold, tingling, silvery voices. The second wonder was that the blackness overhead, all at once, was blazing with stars... One moment there had been nothing but darkness; next moment a thousand, thousand points of light leaped out. If you had seen and heard it... you would have felt quite certain that it was the stars themselves who were singing, and that it was the First Voice, the deep one, which had made them appear and made them sing." That a great Christian apologist such as Lewis used the imagery of a Singer as Creator testifies to the power of song. To quote from the US Catholic bishops' 2007 document, Sing to the Lord, "Sung participation is the source from which the true Christian spirit is derived." Food – or, rather, Music – for thought.

## Cookies for Kairos – 150 Dozen Needed by Noon Wednesday, April 17

Deacon John is on the Kairos Presentation Team and needs support from our parish to contribute 150 dozen home-made cookies. The Kairos Weekend retreat for 36 Christian men incarcerated at Perry Correctional Institution in Pelzer is April 18–21. To help to bring these men to the table is the bottomless bowl of cookies and home-cooked meals brought in by local churches. Since many privileges for the other residents are suspended those four days, the team also gives a dozen cookies (with a Scripture verse in the bag) to all 800+men, as well as all the correction officers at Perry on both Friday and Saturday nights. To that end, the Team needs almost 4,000 dozen cookies. Please consider baking 3, 6, or 10 dozen cookies to be delivered to the Parish Office by noon on April 17. This is a special ministry that serves some of God's most forgotten ones.

The following was <u>written several years ago</u> by Deacon John about a Kairos Retreat and is reprinted here to let you know the difference you are making in the lives of others.

IT WAS JUST A DOZEN COOKIES! To most people it might be a favorite family treat, but I have seen God do amazing things with a dozen cookies. On a Kairos Weekend Retreat in one of the state's correctional institutions, the men on the weekend have almost an unlimited supply of cookies during their four-day retreat. It is true that some men say they just come for the cookies, but by the end of the walk they have gotten so much more. But even more than that, these cookies reach every man in the institution. On Friday and Saturday nights of the Kairos Walk, the team members personally deliver a dozen cookies to every single resident in Perry with a Scripture verse in the bag with the cookies. Smiles, handshakes, exchanged blessings – truly special God moments. The last night of the weekend the residents that have been on the retreat are given three dozen cookies each, and they are drooling until they are told they cannot eat them. They have to give them away to three other men they need to ask forgiveness from or that they need to forgive. These cookies make things happen. One resident said it took three days to get enough courage to give them to another resident who was terrorizing him, but he did and that act of giving brought about their reconciliation. The Kairos weekend has been called by many the Cookie Ministry; I can live with that. If you are reading this while you are waiting for Sunday Mass to start (or if it's Saturday morning while you are finishing up your cup of coffee), the Kairos weekend is actually going on right now. Please stop and take a moment to say a prayer for these men and the men on the team. And for the many talented bakers here at Saint Andrew, a special thank you for sharing God's love and mercy by providing the cookies I was able to bring from you for this retreat. At the time I am writing this, I don't know exactly how many dozen cookies that is, but if last spring is any indication, I am confident it is more than the 75 dozen minimum I was asked to bring. 
