A Note from the Pastor

After celebrating the baptisms, the entries into full communion with the Catholic Church and the confirmations of a bevy of folks, especially our students, our Sunday morning gatherings preparing folks for such milestones continue. With a change.

What used to be called the "Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)" has now become the "Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)." So, what's in a name?

"Order" is used for many things in our Church: the Order of Mass, Holy Order, and Ordinary Time, which does mean commonplace or "un-special" time, but time that unfolds in orderly fashion.

An "order," a process. A movement from one place or situation to another. Which means that the emphasis on what happens each Sunday morning is less about acquiring information about God and the Church and more about helping participants moving from where they are in now their relationship with God to where God seems to be inviting them to be in that relationship.

Not everyone who participates in the OCIA will come to baptism, full communion, or confirmation. And not everyone who does will do so at the same time. OCIA is about knowing, but more about being. About who one is in relationship to God.

"Order" is also a reminder that those involved in this process are a unique group in our midst. When opportune, the process includes specific rituals that mark various stages along the way, especially for those in the process of discerning baptism.

OCIA typically meets each Sunday, 9:45 AM-10:45 AM. Rick Gildersleeve is the facilitator. If you know of someone who would benefit from participating, please invite them to get in touch with me.

This week, we are highlighting the **Pickens County Advocacy Center** as one of the recipients of our parish tithing program. Their mission is to support survivors of sexual assault and abuse through treatment services and to end sexual violence in the Pickens County community. They provide compassion, hope, and healing to survivors, aged four and up, and their families through licensed therapists, legal advocacy, counseling, collaboration and survivor support groups and services. Trained victim advocates answer a crisis hotline 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year to assist sexual violence survivors and initiate hospital accompaniment service. Pickens County Advocacy Center also works with local institutions, schools, law enforcement, social services, legal advocates, and medical personnel. They implement educational and prevention programs throughout the county that focus on consent, healthy relations, and bystander interventions. The center strives to empower victims to reclaim their strength and regain control of their lives as they embark on a path of healing and growth. Volunteers provided over 3000 hours last year and are always welcome.
