A Note from the Pastor

I recently saw that Pope Francis is heading off to Indonesia, Papua New Guinea. East Timor, and Singapore come September. Even with all the amenities of a plane reserved for himself and his entourage, he faces an exhausting ride. Especially on the way home after countless Masses and gatherings. The trip is in keeping with his enthusiasm for the periphery of Catholic life.

Not long ago, he traveled to Mongolia, an expansive country with 3.3 million people of whom just shy of 1,350 are Catholic. About the population of our parish!

What's the point?

Catholics in these far-lung spots know that they're outliers among family and fellow citizens. And for most people, being someone who's the exception can be off-putting and even scary. One Saturday night on the way home from Mass, I sat at the Edgewood/College Ave light and watched a gaggle of gals cross in front of me heading for a night on the town. Same hairdos, same little dresses, same boots – except for one. The little parade was a paradigm for the "I need to look like everyone else" syndrome that effects all of us in so many ways.

Yet the Catholics Pope Francis is visiting seemed to have escaped what afflicts the rest of us. I say "afflict" because the syndrome is just that. Over the years I've listened to students – guys and gals – share their anxieties about not fitting in. And not just when it comes to fashion. Young as they might be, they know it's a moral problem.

We Christians grew like weeds in the centuries before Christianity became popular. Which says two things to me: first, that healthy discipleship is always countercultural, no matter the culture. And second, when we seek cultural acceptance, we begin to diminish, if not in number, certainly in effectiveness. We become commonplace to those not of our number.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus reminds us, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you \dots " and that he had a mission in mind for us – that we "go and bear fruit that will remain."

As we close in on Pentecost, I wonder if we need to revisit what that "fruit" is. Maybe a good place to start is looking at those Jesus invested time, talent, and reputation caring for. And what that care looked like.

It's amazing to realize that once we understand what water-into-wine, resuscitating the dead, and filling the bellies of thousands were really all about, there isn't one thing Jesus did that's beyond our grasp.

Unless we choose to come in from the periphery. Fr. Dan

Our Weekly Parish Tithe

This week's tithe goes to **Camp iRock**, a 3¹/₂-week summer camp for students in Pickens County identified as needing help with reading. Volunteers (including teachers) work with the students to improve their reading while offering typical summer camp fun opportunities. The camp was founded on research showing how critical the 3rd-grade reading level is for reading success in life. This is the last year in school that children learn to read; after this, they read to learn. One in six children who do not read proficiently by 3rd grade do not graduate on time. The United Way of Pickens County has partnered with the School District of Pickens County, the YMCA of Easley, Pickens, and Powdersville, and Call Me MiSTER to develop Camp iRock. One of the program's goals is to have at least 70% of 3rd graders in Pickens County read on grade level by 2025. Last summer, the program helped 486 children in grades K4-3rd. Of those children who attended at least 50% of the camp days (and completed the post-test), 96% maintained or grew their reading level. Learn more at www.uwpickens.org/camp-irock.
